

- Professor Franz Fuerst, Dr Davide Luca, and one of our PhD candidates, Qiumeng Li, published an article in Transportation Research Part D which looked at patterns of e-bike-sharing and bike-sharing.
- Professor Andreas Kontoleon has published on the <u>impacts of REDD+ projects in Sierra Leone</u> and wildlife conservation in China.
- Professor Shaun Larcom and Dr Po-Wen She published on the <u>impact of religion on a person's ability to cope during the Covid-19 lockdowns.</u>
