At the Centre for Resilience and Sustainable Development (CRSD), we co-create actionable evidence for ethical leaders to improve decision making in the context of complexity, uncertainty and inequalities.

Take Cambridge Policy Boot Camp (CPBC) for example: we can discover 'untapped assets' in a given context.

CPBC combines advanced systems dynamics thinking with political economic theories to accelerate decision making for policy leaders. We have worked with 150 countries and companies, linking good governance, sustainable investment and responsible innovation as pillars of resilience and sustainability.

CPBC was developed by Dr Nazia Habib at CRSD using transdisciplinary techniques to accelerate the identification of transformative policy solutions.

On December 14th 2022, around 30 experts gathered at Newnham College and virtually to find practical solutions to the question of how Small Island Developing States (SIDs) can attract sustainable finance for resilience. The wealth of ideas and knowledge gathered in the sessions will now be used to inform future research.

The day had three parts. The first part had a strategic aim to co-create the third phase of the research which is about stress testing the new approach of attracting funds for SIDS.

The second part aimed to discover multipliers using the CERT (Cambridge Expert Round Table), followed by a formal hall dinner where Sir David Khalili presented a gift to the centre as a recognition of the groundbreaking research in full action.
